### CP History – Correction!

Thanks to *Tim Durniak* for this correction . . .

In February 1986, County Players did not produce a show. At that time our seasons were less structured and the Board chose to put their efforts into the spring musical that year and skip the mid-winter production.

The winter “show” was the reconstruction of the theatre lobby directed by *Tim Durniak*, assisted by *John Gates, Doug Woolley* and it featured a *huge ensemble cast*.

At that time County Players had an entrenched schedule of four shows, but in order to facilitate renovating the lobby without hiring a general contractor, the company did not produce a winter show and opted to use the volunteer resources to renovate the lobby instead.

The project’s scope initially was “just the lobby” but as walls were removed the scope was enlarged to encompass the replacement of the electrical system, fabricating/enlarging the dressing rooms, removing the onstage ceiling, and providing better access to the backstage spaces.

This renovation set the stage for the follow-on alterations on the stage proper and the house, which, thankfully, included the hiring of contractors so as not to drain as too many resources away from a theatre production.

The renovation ended the day the musical *Bye, Bye Birdie* opened – the last screws being driven and paint being applied literally as patrons were walking into the theatre!
